

## Lesson Five: Power on, log in and get surfing!

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**Lesson Overview:** In this lesson students will complete a practice drill to show that they can complete the required entry level tasks independently. When they have completed the drill they will take the Internet Driving Test, a multiple choice test included in the accompanying materials.

### **Resources or Materials Needed:**

- Internet ready computers. The lesson is based on Microsoft Internet Explorer.
- interactive whiteboard
- projector
- Internet Driving Test which is included in the accompanying materials.
- Internet Driving Answer Key which is included in the accompanying materials.
- Internet Driving Certificate which is included in the accompanying materials.

**Lesson Objective:** Given access to the Computer Lab, the student should be able to turn on the computer and log on to the school network, start an Internet session and choose an appropriate database, directory or search engine and set it as the homepage. To be successful students must accomplish this independently without assistance from a teacher or other students.

**Time:** Approximately one hour

**Preinstructional activities:** Explain to the students that they are going to complete a drill. Compare it to a fire drill in which there are certain steps that must be followed.

**Content Presentation:** Teacher should have a list of steps to be completed posted on the

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**Learner Participation:** Complete drill. Give students the Internet Driving Test multiple choice test to complete. This test is included in the accompanying materials.

**Assessment:** Assessment of drill is pass or fail. Assessment of the multiple choice test is by use of the Internet Driving Test Answer Key that is included in the accompanying materials.

**Follow-through Activities:** Arrange to have the students presented with their Internet Driving License Certificates at a school assembly or grade meeting. An example is included in the accompanying materials.
